
A GESS education gives students a real-world advantage.

STUDENT SUPPORT & LEARNING

Prioritising Students' Wellbeing

We prepare students to step into the world with confidence, purpose, and a strong sense of self. We believe that true academic success is closely connected to emotional wellbeing. Our students benefit from personalised support, expert guidance, and a caring environment that helps them thrive.



Professional Counselling

We have a team of professional counsellors on campus who bring years of experience in psychology and counselling to the GESS community. Our counsellors are also familiar with the unique challenges that international students face. Be it personal struggles, conflicts with peers, academic stress, or other anxieties, our counsellors offer a warm and safe space for students to openly share and seek help.



School-Family Partnership

We believe in the importance of partnering closely with families to support students. By communicating consistently with families, we gain better insights into students as individuals, their background, and home experiences so our teachers can cater to that in school. Similarly, by keeping families updated about their children's school life and academic progress, we can ensure students get the right support at home for their learning.

Personalised Support for Academic Growth

We recognise the path to academic growth looks different for every student, and we have different channels to maximise the personalised support students can receive on their individual journeys. We aim to address students' academic challenges promptly, pay attention to areas of improvement, and teach students to make use of their strengths.

Homeroom Partnership (Grades 9 to 12)

Homeroom teachers conduct regular check-ins and one-to-one meetings with students. These sessions give every student a chance to discuss their academic challenges and other concerns with their teachers and get practical advice, encouragement, and support.

Coaching and Mentoring Programme (Grades 9 to 12)

This programme gives structure to students' long-term academic and personal goals. Students learn how to plan better, take manageable steps towards their goals, and monitor their progress over time. Eventually, students are able to take ownership over their learning and handle projects, assignments, and exams with preparation and confidence to achieve better outcomes.

After School Subject Support (Grades 11 and 12)

We offer tutoring sessions twice a week for English, mathematics and science subject groups to provide an extra avenue for students to clarify doubts, reinforce understanding of concepts, and work on weaker areas.

Study Hall Sessions (Grades 11 and 12)

Free periods in the day are converted to study hall sessions where students can focus on assignments, project work, and revision under teacher supervision.

To make learning an engaging and multi-dimensional experience with relevance to the real world, we bring lessons outside of the traditional classroom and into many other contexts.

BeyondClassrooms Programme

Our award-winning BeyondClassrooms programme gives students a rare glimpse into the workings of today's top industries, global companies, and organisations. Work Experience

Our Careers Experience Programme equips students with real-world skills and confidence, giving them a competitive edge for their future.

Grade 9: Laying the Foundation

Students explore career options, write CVs, and practice interviews, building essential professional skills and preparing for future opportunities.

Grade 10: Real-World Learning

The programme begins with a mini business unit and project, followed by a two-week work experience placement tailored to each student's professional interests. Guided by our careers team, students gain valuable insights, practical skills, and industry connections.

A Competitive Advantage

This program inspires career aspirations, builds adaptability, and enhances confidence, setting students apart for internships, university, or the workforce.

At GESS, we empower students to thrive in their future endeavours.

Service Learning and Sustainability

Our fully developed Service Learning and Sustainability programme teaches students to become active changemakers who use their skills and abilities to meet community and environmental needs. Students are encouraged to be responsible citizens who pay attention to the local and wider community as well as the environment and think about how they can create impact through service.

UNIVERSITY AND CAREER GUIDANCE

University and Career Guidance Counsellors

The university and career guidance counsellors play an important role in helping students make informed decisions about their future. Career guidance starts in grade 9 and continues till students graduate in grade 12.

Our counsellors organise career information exchanges, host university fairs, and engage external trainers to teach students important skills such as effective interview techniques. For students unsure about what to do after GESS, the counsellors serve as reliable guides, helping students to concretise their education and career goals based on strengths and interests.

Additionally, the team helps students prepare compelling university applications and prepare for admissions interviews to ensure they get into their first-choice universities.

Career Pathways and Support by Grade

University and Career Guidance at a Glance:

Grades 9 and 10 - Career Pathways Programme

Students are taught about the types of career pathways available and how to pursue their dream careers. They are introduced to CV writing and internships, with grade 10 students participating in a 2-week work experience programme where they get first-hand exposure to the working world.

Grade 11

Weekly lessons guide students through selecting universities, choosing suitable undergraduate degree courses, and preparing for university applications. Topics covered include university application processes, writing personal statements, and preparing for admissions interviews.

Grade 12

Weekly lessons focusing on preparing students for life after school. Students explore what it means to live and study independently at university and learn the essential life skills they need to thrive. They also learn about building impressive career profiles, including landing the right internships, networking, and using LinkedIn effectively.

Personalised Education

As part of our commitment to high-quality teaching and learning, students in grades 9 and 10 receive additional tuition and mentoring embedded into the school day. This individualised attention improves learning outcomes and ensures our students thrive in high school.

INTRODUCTION TO GESS LOWER HIGH SCHOOL


Grades 9 and 10

Curriculum: IB Middle Years Programme (MYP)

Lower High School is designed to support students as they transition from Middle School to the rigorous demands of the IB Diploma or IB Careers Programme. We focus on developing the academic skills and personal qualities needed for success in high school and beyond, including critical thinking, time management, and self-directed learning. By strengthening students' academic foundations and offering personalised guidance, we prepare students to excel in the high school pathway qualifications and confidently pursue their university aspirations.

Our educators mentor students to help them improve academic skills such as exam preparation, research techniques, essay writing, and presentation strategies necessary for success in the IB Diploma/IB Careers programme.

In the Lower High School years, students take part in specialist programmes including creative and performing arts, STEM, community service, and sports. Students choose from a range of specialist programmes and options based on their personal interests and career pathway.





LOWER HIGH SCHOOL CURRICULUM


In lower high school, we follow the IB Middle Years Programme. And as part of that, students study the following subjects.



ENGLISH 3 hours per week


The English programme supports and challenges students at their level of proficiency.

- **English Language and Literature course**
Course for learners at native or advanced level of English language proficiency.



SCIENCES 5 hours per week

Students study a comprehensive, in-depth science programme incorporating all three sciences.



DESIGN TECHNOLOGY 2 hours per week

Students learn to work through the design cycle to investigate, design, create, and evaluate products.



MATHEMATICS 3.5 hours per week

Students are placed in streamed mathematics groups based on individual ability.



PHYSICAL AND HEALTH EDUCATION 1 hour per week

Creative movement, ball sports, athletics, and swimming.



SPECIALIST ARTS PROGRAMME 2 hours per week

Students choose to specialise in 1 of 3 arts: music, theatre, or visual arts.



LANGUAGES or ETHICS

3 hours per week,
per subject



Students study at least one other language in addition to English.

Ethics is a branch of philosophy that teaches students to examine concepts such as right and wrong, good and evil, justice and virtue in relation to human behaviour and decision-making.

**Students can now choose this subject in place of a third language.*



INDIVIDUALS AND SOCIETIES

3 hours per week

This is a humanities and social science subject group that focuses on the exploration of human societies, cultures and their interactions with the global environment.

MYP CORE

In addition to the curriculum subjects, Grade 9 and 10 students are required to complete the MYP Core elements.

Service as Action

Lower high school students participate in 3 Service as Action activities every year, including 1 independent project.

Service as Action teaches students to apply their knowledge and skills to contribute to society and the environment.

Students examine current global and local issues and choose to respond to these through action. In the process, they also develop new skills such as planning, executing, and working collaboratively.

Personal Project

Grade 10 students explore a topic they are interested in and create a project around it.

The project is largely self-directed, but students are paired with a mentor who provides consistent guidance along the way.

Students learn to take ownership over their learning, create project plans, find resources, solve challenges along the way, and make critical decisions.

Grades 11 and 12

Curriculum: IB Diploma Programme (DP) or IB Career Programme (CP)

In Upper High School, our dedicated team of experts works closely with each student to ensure they graduate as confident, well-prepared individuals ready to take their next steps in life. Our team of experienced educators, career advisors, and mentors provide personalised support, guidance, and mentorship tailored to each student's goals and aspirations.

Whether students are aiming for university, entrepreneurship, or a professional career, we focus on equipping them with the skills, knowledge, and confidence they need to succeed. By fostering strong relationships and understanding each student's unique potential, our team helps every graduate navigate their chosen high school pathway with clarity and purpose.

To give GESS IB Diploma Programme/Career Programme students the best chance at success, we offer more study hours for IB subjects than many other IB schools.

Pathways Available: IB Diploma vs. IB Careers Programme

Both pathways are internationally recognised and accredited by IB. The IB Diploma Programme is a rigorous academic programme with a global perspective. The comprehensive curriculum covering a broad range of subjects prepares students for higher education worldwide.

The IB Careers Programme provides a more holistic approach, integrating academics and practical career-related skills. It is a specialised programme where students learn to apply their knowledge to real-world career scenarios. After graduation, students in the IB Careers Programme can enter university or progress to a career.





IB DIPLOMA PROGRAMME

The IB Diploma Programme is primarily an academic-focused programme that has a rigorous curriculum and gives students both breadth and depth of knowledge. It prepares students for university studies by refining their critical thinking, research, and independent inquiry skills.

At GESS, IB Diploma students have the added advantage of many subject and language choices. This makes it possible for them to design the right subject combinations they need to pursue their dream university majors and career specialisations in future.

There are 2 components to the IB Diploma Programme:

1. Diploma Programme Curriculum
2. IB Diploma Core

IB DIPLOMA PROGRAMME

1. Diploma Programme Curriculum

Students are required to study 6 subjects from different subject groups. The variety of subject groups ensures breadth of knowledge.

Students must take at least 3 subjects at Higher Level and the rest at Standard Level. Higher Level subjects are more challenging in scope and deepen students' understanding and expertise. Over the 2 years, students receive 300 hours of instruction for Higher Level subjects and 200 hours of instruction for Standard Level subjects. The hours of instruction at GESS are higher than IB requirements and most international schools to allow students extra time to engage with the material at a pace suitable for them.

Our educators and university guidance counsellors are available to advise students on their subject combinations based on their interests and future university and career goals.



2. IB Diploma Core

Creativity, Activity and Service (CAS)

Creativity, Activity and Service is a required core component of the Diploma Programme. Each student is required to select activities, such as sports, arts or academic enrichment clubs, that demonstrate personal growth and experiential learning. Participation and reflection are equally important and students are expected to evidence their participation and achievements. Students must plan their own program which is a balance of creativity, activity and service which meets a number of defined learning outcomes.

The Extended Essay (EE)

The essay requirement acquaints Diploma candidates with the kind of independent research and writing skills expected by universities. The essay encourages the students to add depth to their programme of study, for example, by selecting a topic from one of the higher level courses.

Theory of Knowledge (TOK)

This is an interdisciplinary requirement intended to stimulate critical reflection on the knowledge and experience gained inside and outside the classroom. The course challenges students to question the bases of knowledge, to be aware of subjective and ideological biases, and to develop the ability to analyse evidence that is expressed in rational arguments. It is a key element in encouraging them to appreciate other cultural perspectives.





IB CAREERS PROGRAMME

For students who wish for a more career-focused study in a specialised field, the IB Careers Programme is a great choice. It balances academic study with experiential, career-related learning. Students gain high-level knowledge in their area of specialisation, get hands-on project experience, and develop personal and professional skills that make them ready for the 21st-century working world.

At GESS, “Business and Sustainability” is the specialised pathway offered for IB Careers Programme. Given predictions that by 2030 there will be 24 million jobs in the green economy, this pathway gives students a highly desirable skillset and expertise for the future job market.

There are 3 components to the IB Careers Programme:

1. Career-Related Studies
2. Diploma Programme Courses
3. IB Careers Programme Core

1. Career-Related Studies

Students pursue career-related studies focusing on business and sustainability management at the Sustainability Management School Switzerland (SUMAS).

SUMAS professors and tutors deliver the courses online. GESS students will study in a global classroom, connecting with peers from all around the world.

Examples of mandatory courses students will study:



Fundamentals of sustainability
Leadership
Sustainable innovation

...and more

Examples of specialist courses students can choose:



Sustainable fashion
Sustainable finance and digitalisation
Nature conservation

There will be opportunities to put knowledge into application through a Sustainability Leadership Camp/ Experience and an Integrative Project Experience.

2. Diploma Programme Courses



Students are required to study 4 diploma programme subjects at standard level or higher level. Mathematics and language are mandatory subject groups. Students can choose the other 2 subjects from any IB subject group based on interest, ability, and desired career pathways.

Available subject groups are the same as for IBDP.

3. Careers Programme Core

The CP Core emphasises more experiential and reflections-based learning. The components within CP Core are (a) Personal and Professional Skills, (b) Service Learning, (c) Reflective Project and (d) Language Development.

Students develop personal and professional skills they need to succeed in future careers and work contexts. They learn to design and implement research-based projects and communicate their discoveries in writing and presentation. And students improve their language abilities to be effectively bilingual or multilingual.

- Fast-track into the Sustainability Management School Switzerland's bachelor's degree programme.
- Enrol in other leading global universities.
- Start internships, apprenticeships, and full-time career positions fully equipped with skills necessary to succeed in the 21st-century workplace.
